Save is an anti-food waste and food loss campaign that encourages people to reduce their food print. According to the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), every year 1.3 billion tones of food is wasted. This is equivalent to the same amount produced in the whole of sub-Saharan Africa. At the same time, 1 in every 7 people in the world go to bed hungry and more than 20,000 children under the age of 5 years die daily from hunger.

The World Day to Combat Desertification is Monday, 17 June

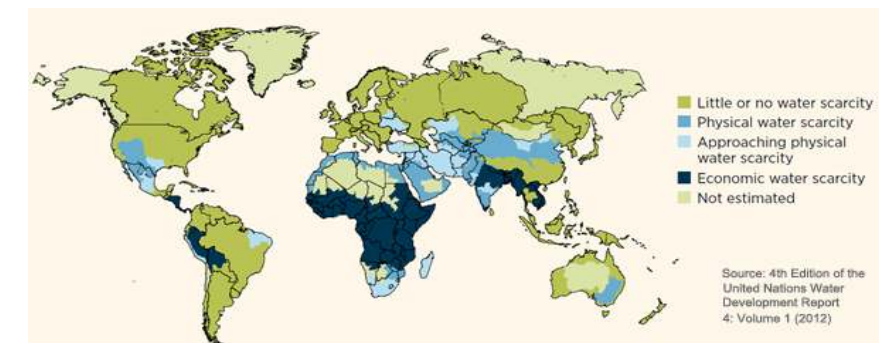
The theme of the 2013 World Day to Combat Desertification is drought and water scarcity.

Why we say there is water Scarcity?

We know.. Freshwater is valuable. Of all the water on Earth, only 2.5 per cent is fresh water. And of all this freshwater, the total usable supply for ecosystems and humans is less than 1 per cent (1%). When demand for water exceeds available supply, it results in water scarcity.

Dry lands are particularly vulnerable to water scarcity. The projected intensification of freshwater scarcity will cause greater stresses in dry lands. While each person needs at least 2,000 cubic meters of water for human well-being and sustainable development every year, on average, people in the dry lands have access to only 1,300 cubic meters.

The goal of the 2013 World Day to Combat Desertification is to create awareness about the risks of drought and water scarcity in the dry lands and beyond, calling attention to the importance of sustaining healthy soils as part of post Rio+20 agenda, as well as the post-2015 sustainable development agenda. This year's slogan, "Don't let our future dry up" calls for everyone to take action to promote preparedness and resilience to water scarcity, desertification and drought. The slogan embodies the message that we are all responsible for water and land conservation and sustainable use, and that there are solutions to these serious natural resource challenges. How the Ceylon Waste Management Pvt. Ltd (CWM) contributes?
